




CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



Academic Success


ON-TIME GRADUATION

School Goals

The Willamette Leadership Academy (WLA) Middle School focuses on preparing students both for high school as well as life after school. The WLA High School focuses on preparing cadets to be contributing, productive members of society with an emphasis on having a strong plan for after high school. Our staff provides a highly structured environment with multiple levels of support and intervention based on individual student needs. This year, we are working to promote positive attendance habits. The middle school has also begun a school garden program, which has massively involved students.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Our goal is to make every family feel supported and welcomed into our building. We take a zero tolerance stance against bullying and take extra steps to ensure our school is safe for students. The middle school has implemented a school-wide Social Emotional Learning curriculum this year to help tend to students' needs as young adults. Meanwhile. the high school is working hard to reward small good deeds and outstanding behavior through its "Good Knight" ticket program which allows cadets to earn prizes and rewards for good behaviors that go above and beyond the call of duty.





Teacher Experience Coming in 2018-19





ADVANCED COURSEWORK
